

Main Diagram




# Requirements

Fabrics from the Arctic Adventure collection.

- 1. CC26.1 True North on Cool Aqua long<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>
- 2. CC27.2 Haring Around on Arctic 70cm
- 3. CC28.3 Arctic Lights, Winter Nights on Teal long<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>
- 4. CC26.3 True North on Midnight Blue ½m
- 5. CC27.1 Haring Around on Light Grey ½m
- 6. CC28.2 Arctic Lights, Winter Nights on Purple long<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>
- 7. CC29.2 Arctic Aura on Cool Purple Grey ½m
- 8. CC29.3 Arctic Aura on Midnight Blue ½m
- 9. CC30.1 Polar Delight on Light Sea Mist ½m
- 10. CC30.2 Polar Delight on Arctic ½m
- 11. White background fabric 1.70m

Wadding and backing 70" x 70"

All measurements include ¼" seam allowances; press each seam as you go.



From fabric 1 cut  $5 \times 7\frac{4}{}$ " cut in half diagonally twice (for block 1)

From fabric 2 cut  $5 \times 7\frac{4}{}$  x  $7\frac{4}{}$  cut in half diagonally twice (for block 1)



### From fabric 3

 $5 \times 3 \frac{7}{8}$ " x  $3 \frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once (for block 1) cut from top left to bottom right. (This is done because of the pattern on the fabric)  $5 \times 3 \frac{7}{8}$ " x  $3 \frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once (for block 1) cut from bottom left to

top right. (This is done because of the pattern on the fabric)

From fabric 4 cut

8 x 7½" x 7½" cut in half diagonally twice for (block 2)

From fabric 5 cut

8 x 71/4" x 71/4" cut in half diagonally twice (for block 2)

From fabric 6

From each of the fabrics 7, 8, 9 and 10 you need to cut

(this will be for block 3)

 $12 \times 2$  5/8"  $\times$  9 3/8" cut a 45° angle from the left corner



 $12 \times 25/8$ "  $\times 7\frac{1}{4}$ " cut a  $45^{\circ}$  angle from the right corner



From fabric 11 cut 6 x 2½" x WOF (border)

12 x 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" cut in half diagonally twice (for block 3)

 $78\times3$   $\mbox{\scriptsize 7/8}"\times3$   $\mbox{\scriptsize 7/8}"$  cut in half diagonally once (for blocks 1~&~2)

Making up the blocks

Blocks 1 and 2 are made up in the same way.







Block 2






















Sew a small triangle on each side of the large triangle.





right side, press back



and then the left side.

You will have some fabric 'ears' which can be trimmed off as you go.
When all Flying Geese blocks are made lay them out as in block 1.
Stitch in groups of two to made a square and then sew the top row together. Do the same on the bottom two. Next stitch the top and bottom rows together to complete the block. For block 1 you need 5 blocks in total and block 2 you need 8 blocks in total.

# Bottom part of block diagram

Lay out the fabrics for the block. Sew the left strip to the triangle, press back. Now stitch the right-hand side strip to complete this part of the block. You will do the same to all four parts. Next stitch two set of triangles together and then sew the two halves together to complete the block. In total you need 12 of block 3.

# Quilt centre.

Lay out all the blocks as in the main diagram and sew in rows. Pressing the seam in the opposite way on each row as this will help when sewing the rows together.



#### Border

You need to join your fabric to get the length for the border strips.  $2 \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ "  $\times 60\frac{1}{2}$ " for the sides  $2 \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ "  $\times 64\frac{1}{2}$ " for top and bottom. Stitch the sides strips to the quilt, press back and then the top and bottom to complete the quilt.

# Quilting

Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together. Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim the backing and wadding to size of quilt.

## Binding

Use your favorite method from fabric 2 to bind the quilt.

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
